### the depth

- Psa 107:8** Oh that [men] would praise the LORD [for] his goodness, and [for] his wonderful works to the children of men!
- Pro 25:3** The heaven for height, and the earth for depth, and the heart of kings [is] unsearchable.
- Eph 3:18** May be able to comprehend with all saints what [is] the breadth, and length, and depth, and height;

### riches

- Rom 2:4** Or despisest thou the riches of his goodness and forbearance and longsuffering; not knowing that the goodness of God leadeth thee to repentance?
- Rom 9:23** And that he might make known the riches of his glory on the vessels of mercy, which he had afore prepared unto glory,
- Eph 1:7** In whom we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, according to the riches of his grace;
- Eph 2:7** That in the ages to come he might shew the exceeding riches of his grace in [his] kindness toward us through Christ Jesus.
- Eph 3:8** Unto me, who am less than the least of all saints, is this grace given, that I should preach among the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ;

<b>Eph 3:10</b>	To the intent that now unto the principalities and powers in heavenly [places] might be known by the church the manifold wisdom of God,
<b>Eph 3:16</b>	That he would grant you, according to the riches of his glory, to be strengthened with might by his Spirit in the inner man;
<b>Col 1:27</b>	To whom God would make known what [is] the riches of the glory of this mystery among the Gentiles; which is Christ in you, the hope of glory:
<b>Col 2:2</b>	That their hearts might be comforted, being knit together in love, and unto all riches of the full assurance of understanding, to the acknowledgement of the mystery of God, and of the Father, and of Christ;
<b>Col 2:3</b>	In whom are hid all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge.

<b>Job 5:9</b>	Which doeth great things and unsearchable; marvellous things without number:
<b>Job 9:10</b>	Which doeth great things past finding out; yea, and wonders without number.
<b>Job 11:7</b>	Canst thou by searching find out God? canst thou find out the Almighty unto perfection?
<b>Job 11:8</b>	[It is] as high as heaven; what canst thou do? deeper than hell; what canst thou know?
<b>Job 11:9</b>	The measure thereof [is] longer than the earth, and broader than the sea.
<b>Job 26:14</b>	Lo, these [are] parts of his ways: but how little a portion is heard of him? but the thunder of his power who can understand?
<b>Job 33:13</b>	Why dost thou strive against him? for he giveth not account of any of his matters.
<b>Job 37:19</b>	Teach us what we shall say unto him; [for] we cannot order [our speech] by reason of darkness.
<b>Job 37:23</b>	[Touching] the Almighty, we cannot find him out: [he is] excellent in power, and in judgment, and in plenty of justice: he will not afflict.
<b>Psa 36:6</b>	Thy righteousness [is] like the great mountains; thy judgments [are] a great deep: O LORD, thou preservest man and beast.

<b>Psa 40:5</b>	Many, O LORD my God, [are] thy wonderful works [which] thou hast done, and thy thoughts [which are] to us-ward: they cannot be reckoned up in order unto thee: [if] I would declare and speak [of them], they are more than can be numbered.
<b>Psa 77:19</b>	Thy way [is] in the sea, and thy path in the great waters, and thy footsteps are not known.
<b>Psa 92:5</b>	O LORD, how great are thy works! [and] thy thoughts are very deep.
<b>Psa 97:2</b>	Clouds and darkness [are] round about him: righteousness and judgment [are] the habitation of his throne.
<b>Ecc 3:11</b>	He hath made every [thing] beautiful in his time: also he hath set the world in their heart, so that no man can find out the work that God maketh from the beginning to the end.
<b>Dan 4:35</b>	And all the inhabitants of the earth [are] reputed as nothing: and he doeth according to his will in the army of heaven, and [among] the inhabitants of the earth: and none can stay his hand, or say unto him, What doest thou?
